Performance . . . Elmsley count to show three face up cards all the same and one card amongst them that is questions side uppermost. You patter, prior to the E/C, that you will cause one of the cards to somersault questions side uppermost. Everyone assumes that the card was already questions side uppermost so . . . you offer to do it again!

E/C again and there are two cards face up and two questions side uppermost.

The final card of this count is placed under the packet.

E/C again and there are three questions side uppermost cards and only one face up. The face up card should be upjogged during the count so that it can be easily removed in a few seconds.

Ask if they would like to see the last card somersault over visibly.

Simply take hold of the card, flip it questions side uppermost and place it to the bottom of the packet!

E/C again and all four cards are seen to be questions side uppermost.

Ask if anyone can remember what is on the faces of the cards.

Finally, flip the packet face up to reveal four different faces!!

You can deal the first card, the double facer, to the table then casually flash the other sides of the other three cards as you show them.

Patter depends on the images present in your set of cards and is left to your own devising. I patter about a quiz game like 'Who Wants To Be A Millionaire?' or 'The Weakest Link' etc.

I say that I was answering questions on my specialised subject ... name the image present on your two duplicate cards. The cards flip over one at a time (so that you can see the questions ... and answers). Finally ... you are outsmarted when the cards change to four different subjects ... general knowledge and you lose!

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
