EFFECT: Four red-backed cards are shown front and back. All are the same value, but different suits. An odd card is added to them and this is seen to have a blue back. Each time the cards are counted slowly and carefully to allow the spectators to note exactly what cards are used.

Now for the questions! The odd card is laid down face up. Next to it goes one of the other cards, also face up and, next to that, another card face down.

To help the spectators, the two remaining cards are shown and placed on the table face up to one side, or placed face outwards in the magician's top pocket.

Pointing to the centre face up card, the performer asks the colour of its back. "Red", is the answer. Turned over, the card is seen to have a blue back. Next, the spectator is asked the colour of the odd card's back. Since one of the red-backed cards has changed from red to blue, the usual answer is that this must be red. When turned over, this proves to have no back at all...it's blank.

So far the spectator hasn't done too well, but he still has a third chance. One card is still face down. Since the spectator can see the other three cards of the same value, he shouldn't have much difficulty in naming the colour of its face. He says, "It's a Spade, therefore it must be black." He turns the card over and it is a Spade...but it's a red one.
